


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IR Receiver Modules for Remote Control Systems

DESCRIPTION

The TSOP93...DF1P series devices are the latest generation miniaturized IR receiver modules for infrared remote control systems. These series provide improvements in sensitivity to remote control signals in dark ambient as well as in sensitivity in the presence of optical disturbances e.g. from CFLs.

The devices contain a PIN diode and a preamplifier assembled on a lead frame. The epoxy package contains an IR filter. The demodulated output signal can be directly connected to a microprocessor for decoding.

The TSOP931..DF1P, TSOP933..DF1P, and TSOP935..DF1P, series devices are designed to receive short burst codes (6 or more carrier cycles per burst). The third digit designates the AGC level (AGC1, AGC3, or AGC5) and the last two digits designate the band-pass frequency (see table below). The higher the AGC, the better noise is suppressed, but the lower the code compatibility. AGC3 provides enhanced noise suppression and AGC5 provides maximized noise suppression. Generally, we advise to select the highest AGC that satisfactorily receives the desired remote code.

These components have not been qualified to automotive specifications.







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Fig. 1 - Output Delay and Pulse-Width




Fig. 4 - Pulse-Width vs. Irradiance in Dark Ambient




Fig. 2 - Pulse-Width vs. Irradiance in Dark Ambient





Fig. 5 - Frequency Dependence of Responsivity






Fig. 6 - Sensitivity in Bright Ambient

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


Fig. 7 - Sensitivity vs. Supply Voltage Disturbances




Fig. 8 - Max. Envelope Duty Cycle vs. Burst Length




Fig. 9 - Sensitivity vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 10 - Relative Spectral Sensitivity vs. Wavelength




Fig. 11 - Directivity




Fig. 12 - Sensitivity vs. Supply Voltage

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SUITABLE DATA FORMAT

This series is designed to suppress spurious output pulses due to noise or disturbance signals. The devices can distinguish data signals from noise due to differences in frequency, burst length, and envelope duty cycle. The data signal should be close to the device's band-pass center frequency (e.g. 38 kHz) and fulfill the conditions in the table below.

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When a data signal is applied to the product in the presence of a disturbance, the sensitivity of the receiver is automatically reduced by the AGC to insure that no spurious pulses are present at the receiver's output. Some examples which are suppressed are:

- DC light (e.g. from tungsten bulbs sunlight)
- · Continuous signals at any frequency




Fig. 13 - IR Emission from Fluorescent Lamp With Low Modulation




Fig. 14 - IR Emission from Fluorescent Lamp With High Modulation

- Strongly or weakly modulated patterns from fluorescent lamps with electronic ballasts (see Fig. 13 or Fig. 14)



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ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Reflow Soldering

 Reflow soldering must be done within 72 h while stored under a max. temperature of 30 °C, 60 % RH after opening the dry pack envelope


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- Set the furnace temperatures for pre-heating and heating in accordance with the reflow temperature profile as shown in the diagram. Exercise extreme care to keep the maximum temperature below 260 °C. The temperature shown in the profile means the temperature at the device surface. Since there is a temperature difference between the component and the circuit board, it should be verified that the temperature of the device is accurately being measured
- Handling after reflow should be done only after the work surface has been cooled off

Manual Soldering

- Use a soldering iron of 25 W or less. Adjust the temperature of the soldering iron below 300 °C
- Finish soldering within 3 s
- Handle products only after the temperature has cooled off





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



Standard bar code labels for finished goods

The standard bar code labels are product labels and used for identification of goods. The finished goods are packed in final packing area. The standard packing units are labeled with standard bar code labels before transported as finished goods to warehouses. The labels are on each packing unit and contain Vishay Semiconductor GmbH specific data.




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DRY PACKING

The reel is packed in an anti-humidity bag to protect the devices from absorbing moisture during transportation and storage.



FINAL PACKING

The sealed reel is packed into a cardboard box. A secondary cardboard box is used for shipping purposes.

RECOMMENDED METHOD OF STORAGE

Dry box storage is recommended as soon as the aluminum bag has been opened to prevent moisture absorption. The following conditions should be observed, if dry boxes are not available:

- Storage temperature 10 °C to 30 °C
- Storage humidity ≤ 60 % RH max.

After more than 72 h under these conditions moisture content will be too high for reflow soldering.


In case of moisture absorption, the devices will recover to the former condition by drying under the following condition:

192 h at 40 °C + 5 °C / - 0 °C and < 5 % RH (dry air / nitrogen) or

96 h at 60 °C + 5 °C and < 5 % RH for all device containers

24 h at 125 °C + 5 °C not suitable for reel or tubes.

An EIA JEDEC® standard J-STD-020 level 4 label is included on all dry bags.

ESD PRECAUTION

Proper storage and handling procedures should be followed to prevent ESD damage to the devices especially when they are removed from the antistatic shielding bag. Electrostatic sensitive devices warning labels are on the packaging.

VISHAY SEMICONDUCTORS STANDARD BAR CODE LABELS
