## **IR Receiver Modules for Remote Control Systems**

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The TSOP99...TR1 series devices are the latest generation miniaturized IR receiver modules for infrared remote control systems. These series provide improvements in sensitivity to remote control signals in dark ambient as well as in sensitivity in the presence of optical disturbances e.g. from CFLs.

The devices contain a PIN diode and a preamplifier assembled on a lead frame. The epoxy package contains an IR filter. The demodulated output signal can be directly connected to a microprocessor for decoding.

The TSOP992..TR1 and TSOP994..TR1, series devices are designed to receive long burst codes (10 or more carrier cycles per burst). The third digit designates the AGC level (AGC2 or AGC4) and the last two digits designate the band-pass frequency (see table below). The higher the AGC, the better noise is suppressed, but the lower the code compatibility. AGC2 provides basic noise suppression and AGC4 provides enhanced noise suppression. Generally, we advise to select the highest AGC that satisfactorily receives the desired remote code.

These components have not been qualified to automotive specifications.

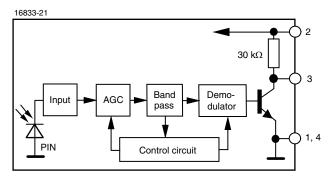

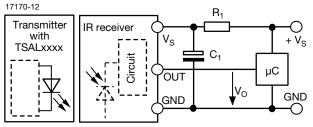

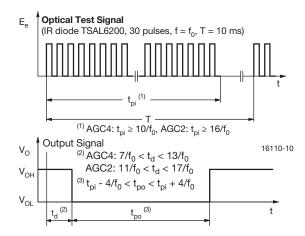


Fig. 1 - Output Delay and Pulse-Width

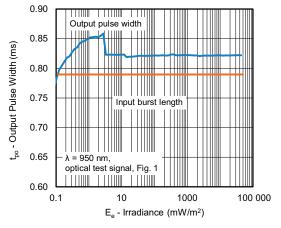
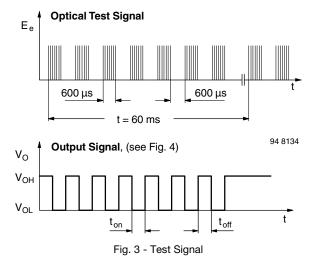


Fig. 2 - Pulse-Width vs. Irradiance in Dark Ambient



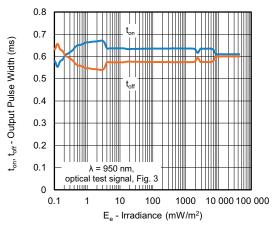


Fig. 4 - Pulse-Width vs. Irradiance in Dark Ambient

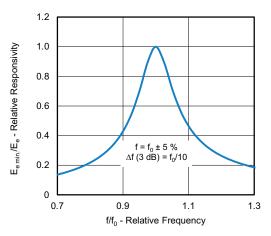


Fig. 5 - Frequency Dependence of Responsivity

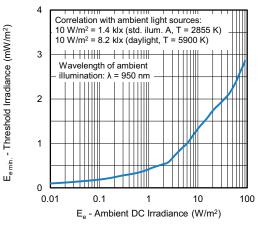


Fig. 6 - Sensitivity in Bright Ambient

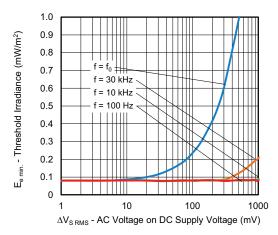
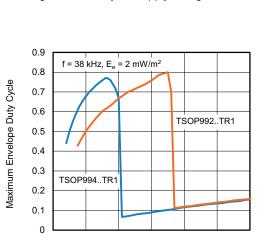


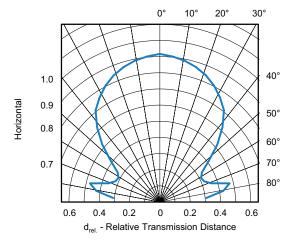
Fig. 7 - Sensitivity vs. Supply Voltage Disturbances

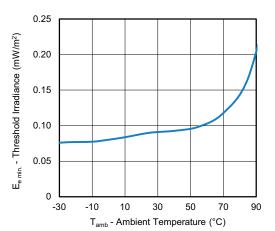


Fig. 9 - Sensitivity vs. Ambient Temperature

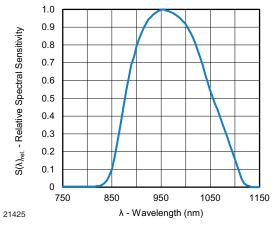


Fig. 10 - Relative Spectral Sensitivity vs. Wavelength

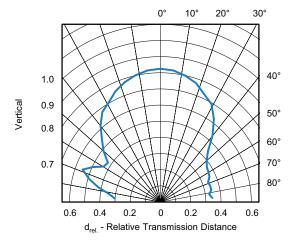
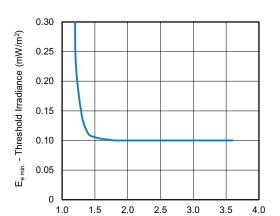


Fig. 11 - Horizontal and Vertical Directivity

#### SUITABLE DATA FORMAT

This series is designed to suppress spurious output pulses due to noise or disturbance signals. The devices can distinguish data signals from noise due to differences in frequency, burst length, and envelope duty cycle. The data signal should be close to the device's band-pass center frequency (e.g. 38 kHz) and fulfill the conditions in the table below.

When a data signal is applied to the product in the presence of a disturbance, the sensitivity of the receiver is automatically reduced by the AGC to insure that no spurious pulses are present at the receiver's output. Some examples which are suppressed are:

- DC light (e.g. from tungsten bulbs sunlight)
- · Continuous signals at any frequency

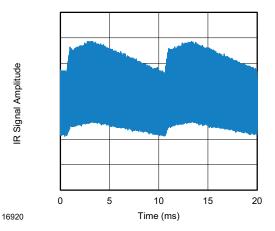


Fig. 13 - IR Emission from Fluorescent Lamp With Low Modulation

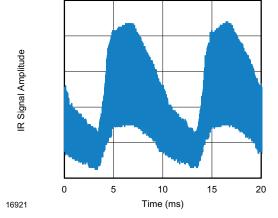


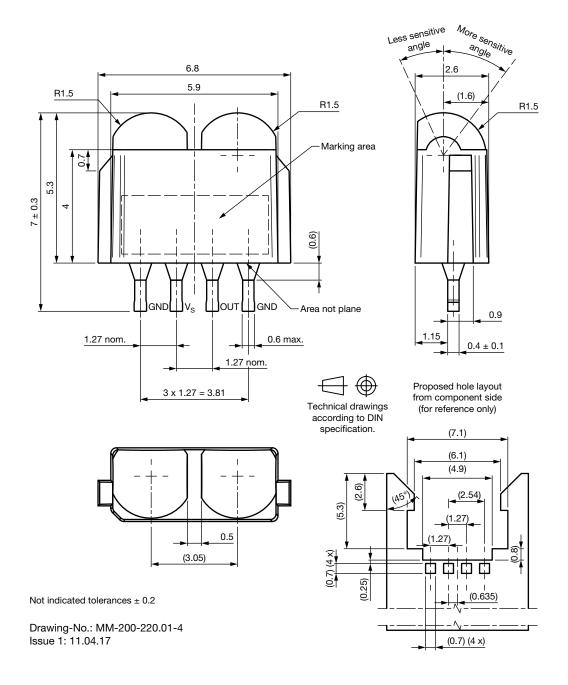
Fig. 14 - IR Emission from Fluorescent Lamp With High Modulation

- Strongly or weakly modulated patterns from fluorescent lamps with electronic ballasts (see Fig. 13 or Fig. 14)

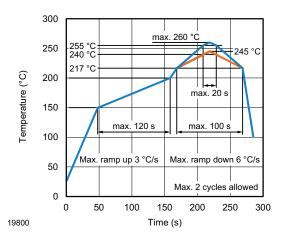

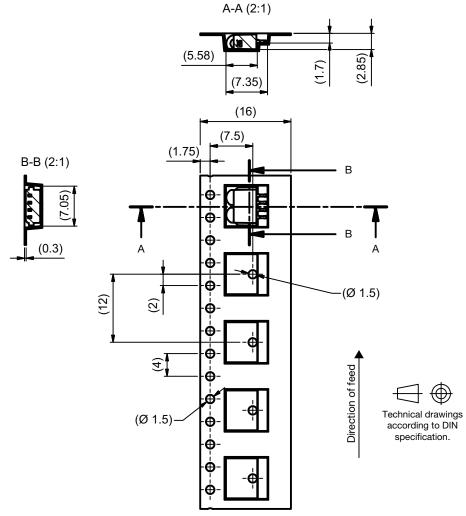

#### TAPING VERSION TSOP..TR1 DIMENSIONS in millimeters



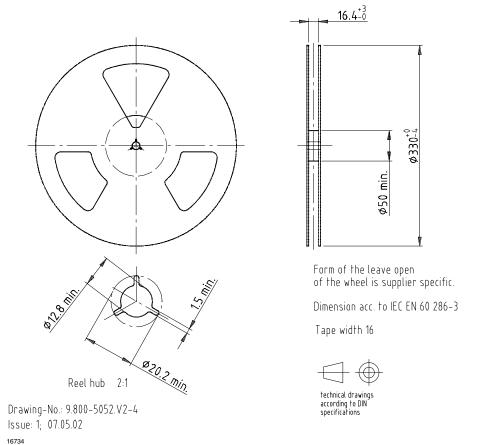

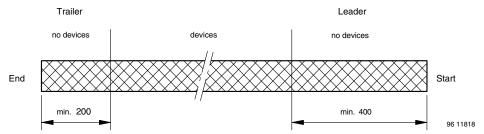


#### **REEL DIMENSIONS** in millimeters

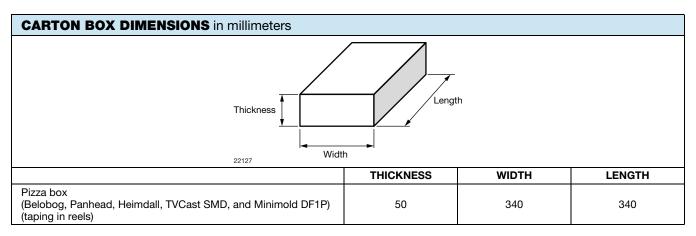
#### **LEADER AND TRAILER DIMENSIONS** in millimeters

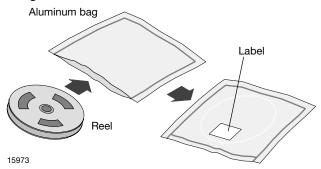

#### **DRY PACKING**

The reel is packed in an anti-humidity bag to protect the devices from absorbing moisture during transportation and storage.

#### RECOMMENDED METHOD OF STORAGE

Dry box storage is recommended as soon as the aluminum bag has been opened to prevent moisture absorption. The following conditions should be observed, if dry boxes are not available:

- Storage temperature 10 °C to 30 °C
- Storage humidity ≤ 60 % RH max.

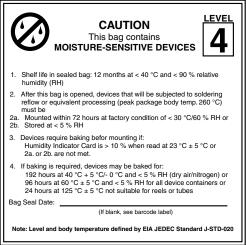
After more than 72 h under these conditions moisture content will be too high for reflow soldering.

In case of moisture absorption, the devices will recover to the former condition by drying under the following condition: 192 h at  $40 \,^{\circ}\text{C} + 5 \,^{\circ}\text{C}$  / -  $0 \,^{\circ}\text{C}$  and <  $5 \,^{\circ}\text{K}$  RH (dry air /

96 h at 60 °C + 5 °C and < 5 % RH for all device containers

24 h at 125 °C + 5 °C not suitable for reel or tubes.

An EIA JEDEC® standard J-STD-020 level 4 label is included on all dry bags.

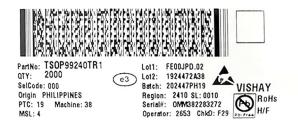
