




Fig. 2 - Forward Current Limit vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 3 - Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig. 4 - Radiant Intensity vs. Forward Current




Fig. 7 - Lead (Pb)-free Reflow Solder Profile According to J-STD-020




Fig. 5 - Relative Radiant Power vs. Wavelength




Fig. 6 - Relative Radiant Intensity vs. Angular Displacement

### DRYPACK

Devices are packed in moisture barrier bags (MBB) to prevent the products from moisture absorption during transportation and storage. Each bag contains a desiccant.

### **FLOOR LIFE**

Time between soldering and removing from MBB must not exceed the time indicated in J-STD-020:

Moisture sensitivity: level 4

Floor life: 72 h

Conditions:  $T_{amb}$  < 30 °C, RH < 60 %

### DRYING

In case of moisture absorption devices should be baked before soldering. Conditions see J-STD-020 or label. Devices taped on reel dry using recommended conditions 192 h at 40 °C (+ 5 °C), RH < 5 %.

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


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
